The goal is to provide youth with the knowledge and skills necessary to prevent accidents and respond to emergencies while supervising younger children. They will learn basic care, child safety and first aid skills as well as receive CPR training! This online, self-paced course must be completed within one calendar year of registration and is meant for individuals who have an interest in buying and/or selling real estate or who may be considering employment in a related field. 

Poland Regional High School News



This summer American Legion Post 150 sponsored three PRHS students, Mabel Tyler, Emma Crouse, and Emma MacMahon, to attend Dirigo State. The students learned about Maine government and the legislative process. Emma MacMahon was selected to represent Maine at Girls Nation in Washington, D.C.



The American Legion, Department of Maine Dirigo State is a comprehensive, experiential learning, youth leadership program.

It is designed after the Maine State government, where all students come together to create their own town, county, and state governing bodies. Simply put, Dirigo State is a combination of Boys State and Girls State, but that's just the start. The Legion Family redesigned and strengthened both programs into a unique, first for the American Legion National Family, combined youth government leadership program. The Legion Family feels the union of Boys and Girls State will provide a better experience for all students and a more realistic simulation of Maine State government.

Elise Gagnon and Aslan Bake, PRHS seniors and Lewiston Regional Technical Center (LRTC) students, participated in the SkillsUSA Championship in Atlanta, GA on this summer - Aslan was recognized with a SkillPoint Certificate in Employment Application Process.





Elm Street School applied for the Title IA Reallocation Grant to provide students with additional learning opportunities to prevent summer slide. Our application was approved for the second year in a row and 14 ESS staff serviced 62 students in grades PreK-5! We received \$46,095 to fund our program! We also applied for a second grant, the American Rescue Plan, which provides federal stimulus funds to support schools in safely reopening and sustaining safe operations while meeting the academic, social, emotional, and mental health needs of students resulting from the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic. This grant provided resources to support our summer program (Farm to Table theme) and outdoor learning. We received \$21,254.48 in funding to purchase these resources that will extend beyond summer learning.

Our overarching theme for our program this year was "Farm to Table". Students learned about farming, caring for a school garden, and how crops make their way from the garden to our homes. Students visited Goss Berry Farm and were able to tour the farm and learn about a day in the life of a berry farmer in our local community. They also had the unique opportunity to pick blueberries and raspberries giving them a first-hand experience of what it's like to harvest crops while enjoying delicious local fruits. A culminating activity included a family-style meal celebration using the book, "Stone Soup", as inspiration, as part of our family engagement goal, and a trip to the Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens where students explored the gardens and participated in a "Life Cycle of a Plant" guided tour provided by the educators at the venue.
